STUDENTS

The year began with 26 new students in our Scholars Programme and 12 students in the Degree Programmes, 2 of whom were continuing students and 10 were new students. DONATIONS

EVENTS



ACU successfully hosted a number of events during the course of the year. Some of these were the Christian Scholars Week, the Faculty Development Workshop Series, Preview Days and the Annual Chancellor's Dinner.

• Our speaker for this year's Christian Scholars Week, Dr. James White, spoke on the theme: "Defending the Faith". It was a

great opportunity for staff and students alike to witness Christian Scholarship modelled by Dr. White.

- The Faculty Development Workshop Series fulfils our ongoing efforts to equip prospective faculty to teach their respective disciplines from a Biblical Worldview perspective. We had about 8 individuals complete the series this year.
- We hosted 2 Preview Days this year as opposed to our normal one a year. The reason for this change was to accommodate both for prospective students who were in school and for those who would want to attend during the school holidays. We had a number of prospective students attending both of these and getting a real sense of what ACU is about. It was encouraging to see them integrate so well with our current student population.

- At the Reformed Family Conference, run annually by the Reformed Baptist Churches in Lusaka, our students got the opportunity to participate by helping out with logistical activities such as registration, media, security and ushering. It was a delight to see them serve joyfully even under pressure.
- The Chancellor's Dinner was held on 8th December, 2018. The theme for this year was "A case for Classical Education in Africa: Is it worth it?" Pastor Choolwe Mwetwa was the keynote speaker who addressed the theme very well. The other speakers included Mr. Benjamin Katubiya who is the CEO of BUK Zambia, Simbi Uwishaka, a 2nd year student studying Agriculture and Dr. Conrad Mbewe, the Chancellor. We were encouraged by the turnout at the dinner and the pledges made towards the work of ACU. All in all, this year's dinner was a success.

FACULTY AND STAFF

During the course of the year, we have had a number of changes in our staff and faculty. Mr. Ntobeko Mjijwa joined us from South Africa as a lecturer in Creative Arts. Dr. Ben Killian, and his family, joined us from the United States of America to head up the Agriculture Programme.
